Further, Section 18004(e) of the CARES Act, Pub. L. No. 116, 134 Stat. 281, directs institutions receiving funds under Section 18004 of the Act to submit (in a time and manner required by the Secretary of Education) a report to the Secretary describing the use of funds distributed from the HEERF. Accordingly, the following information must appear in a format and location that is easily accessible to the public 30 days after the date when the institution received its allocation under 18004(a)(1) and updated every 45 days thereafter:

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### **Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting**

On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). Lincoln Technical Institute\* (“LTI”), Iselin, New Jersey, received a portion of these funds that LTI is required by law to send directly to eligible students.

In addition, LTI was required to sign a Certification and Agreement in order to access funds under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (“HEERF”) program. This Certification and Agreement requires each institution applying for HEERF funds to comply with Section 18004(e) of the CARES Act.

1. LTI signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education (“Department”) the Certification and Agreement that assures our institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

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
